Ride Classifications

PACE CATEGORIES - Road bike recommended

AX For strong, experienced cyclist in top physical condition. Average speed is 18 mph or more.

A+ For strong, experienced cyclist. Average speed is 17 to 18 mph.

A For strong, experienced cyclist. Average speed is 16 to 17 mph.

A- For strong experienced cyclist. Average speed is 15 to 16 mph.

B+ For good, competent cyclists. Average speed is 14 to 15 mph.

B For good, competent cyclists. Average speed is 13 to 14 mph.

B- For good, competent cyclist. Average speed is 12 to 13 mph.

C+ For average cyclists. Average speed is 11 to 12 mph.

C For average cyclists. Average speed is 10 to 11 mph.

C- For average cyclists. Average speed is 9 to 10 mph.

D For novice cyclist. Average speed is 9 mph or less.

Speeds indicate average upon completion of ride. Speeds will vary during ride depending on terrain.

TERRAIN RATINGS

1 Hill Mania (multiple long and/or steep climbs)

2 Large Hills (such as Hillcrest Road in Warren or Johnston Drive in Watchung)

3 Rolling Hills (such as Valley Road in Warren Township)

4 Mostly flat (except for occasional overpasses)

ATB RATINGS- For All-terrain and hybrids. Average speed will vary with terrain and rider's experience.

1 Log Novice. Basically flat. Typically tow paths and fire roads.

2 Logs Intermediate. Rolling. Rough paths and fire roads.

3 Logs Advanced. Numerous steep hills, some technical

MTB RATINGS- For All-terrain bikes only. Speeds will vary.

1 Log Novice. Basically flat to smooth.

2 Logs Intermediate. Rolling, rugged.

3 Logs Advanced. Hilly, technical.

Bicycle Weekend in the Green and Adirondack Mountains

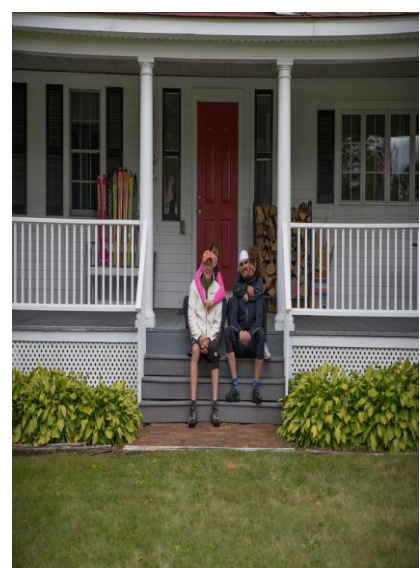
On 9/12-9/14, riders made the drive to the Highlife Ski Club lodge in Chittenden, VT. to enjoy a weekend of hill climbing. The lodge is a converted farm house that can accommodate up to 50 adventurers. We had it to ourselves this weekend as it was between the seasons.

The first days' route tackled an elevation of approximately 1500 ft. with exhilarating descents and rolling climbs. Though the run was only a 16 mile loop, everyone's legs were challenged. Our speed averaged only 10 mph and this included downhill schusses that broke 40 mph. Afternoon refreshments followed as we toured the Long Trail Brewery, the Foundry Restaurant, and the Inn at McGrath's Long Trail, soft rock and Irish folk music closed out our day. Our Sunday ride was on a return drive. We drove to Lake George, secured parking at Fort William McHenry and ventured onto the Warren County bicycle trail. The section of the trail we rode, Lake George to Glen Lake, consisted of 9 miles of paved path under a canopy of green. Rolling hills, the occasional fellow rider or hiker made for a scenic ride. The trail could continue to Glens Falls however it becomes gravel and a hybrid or mountain bike is your viable option vs. portage.

All in all, it was wonderful excursion; we look forward to riding it again and extending the rides. Hope you can join us next time out.

Looking for somewhere new to ride your bike? Join the Pinelands Preservation Alliance and our all-star committee of volunteers for **five single-day bicycle tours of the Pinelands National Reserve!**

The Tour will stop at various locations to highlight the natural, cultural and historic treasures of the Pinelands, including historic Batsto Village, Leeds Point - birthplace of the Jersey Devil, Chatsworth, Wharton State Forest, Barnegat Bay and more.

Each day's tour ranges from 40-55 miles per day with average speeds of 11-13 mph and they begin and end at the same location. Everyone gets cue sheets for the ride so you can ride at your own speed.

You can ride one day or all five days - it is up to you. The Tour de Pines is a voluntary, non-competitive, unsupported ride. Meet, great people and see amazing places.

1,100 miles, 11 riding days, 2 hiking days



Beginning in Albuquerque, NM, we will ride 500 miles to the Grand Canyon in 5 days. We have a stay over day hiking at the Canyon. Our return trip will include one day of hiking at Canyon de Chelly before returning to Albuquerque. This is a popular tour encompasses plenty of southwest culture with a good mix of cycling and hiking in beautiful areas of Arizona.

Tour of Ghana, Africa

A new tour for late October will be a combination road and mountain bike tour in Ghana, Africa. The tour will be about 12 days including travel days and visits to the slave trader forts. We will be staying in nicer resort hotels and eating in restaurants. NJBWC wins grants for bike depot in Montclair

The [Partners for Health Foundation](#) has awarded NJBWC a \$14,000 grant to build an enclosed storage area, or "Bike Depot", at the Bay Street NJ Transit train station. This award is in addition to the [Sustainable Jersey Small Grant Program](#) award of \$20,000 that NJBWC partnered with Montclair Township to win last spring for the depot.



The Bike Depot will provide safe, secure storage of bicycles for riders of NJ Transit who are commuting by bike either to NYC or from NYC to points in New Jersey. This will be the first depot of its kind in the state and will serve as an exemplar to NJ Transit for stations across the state.

National Bike Challenge - final month!

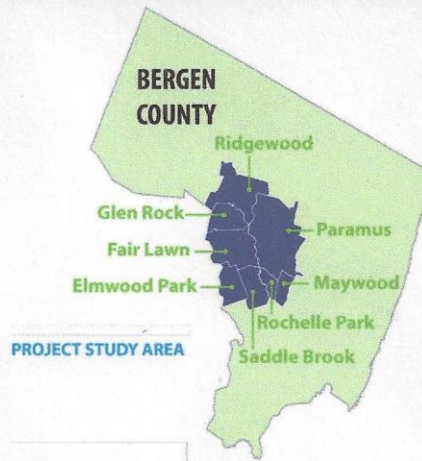

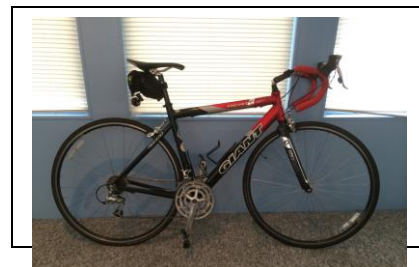

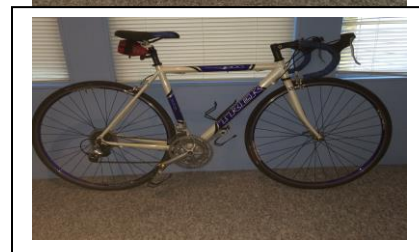
